




Molalla Area Seniors Board - General Meeting Minutes and Information

MAS, Inc. General Meeting Minutes January 26, 2024

The meeting was called to order by President Bob McNeil. Minutes of the December 29, 2023 annual general meeting were read by Secretary Sandy Kundert. A motion was made by Wilma Coleman, seconded by Stanley Weaver, and approved to accept the minutes as read.

Treasurer Pat Torsen reported a beginning checking account balance of \$5,095.65, income of \$14,332.00 plus a \$3,000 transfer to checking from the Money Market account, and disbursements of \$9,345.50 and a deposit of \$6,723.00 to the Money Market account, leaving an ending checking account balance of \$6,359.15. The savings account balance is \$124.12. The Allete Fund balance was \$40,711.73. The money market account balance was reported at \$249,164.27, including a building fund balance \$214,855.84. Pat reported that the appeal donations were at about \$8,500 and gave a summary of some of the fundraising efforts, including the sum of \$2,971 from the quilters and \$683 from painting classes given by Lacressia St. Clair. All of the fundraising activities have been designated toward the building fund. A motion was made by motion was made by Gloria Wood, seconded by Tara Martin, and approved to accept the treasurer's report.

Center Director Amanda Estrada reported a net income of \$5,276.44. The Center provided meals and added three new Meals on Wheels clients. Three hundred sixty-nine bus rides were provided as well as 15 hours of case management. The second salad bar lunch had 30 people attending, up from 12 the previous month. A profit of \$122 was designated to the building fund. Plans for February include a Taco Soup & Salad Bar. Share the Love would like a video from the Center to use in starting their 2024 campaign. One of our members, Gordon Haag, wants to donate a large generator and propane tank for the new Center to use as a power backup when needed.

Under Old Business Bob reported that the wetland survey had been approved for the Heinz Street property and preparation for closing on the property was in process with the title company, expected in the next 30 days.

Under New Business, President Bob McNeil presented certificates of appreciation to Don Gulliford and Lorraine Peters for their service on the Board of Directors and he also reminded us of the upcoming Ladies' Tea on February 10, which is a fundraising event for the new center, at the cost of \$15.00 per ticket. He announced that the next board meeting was scheduled for February 14 at 3 p.m. and the next general meeting would be held February 24 at 12:15 p.m.

Drawings: The \$5 door prize was won by Vera Miller and the pie drawing was won by Howard Miller.

A motion was made by Wilma Coleman, seconded by Gloria Wood and approved to adjourn the meeting at 12:40 p.m.

Our Molalla Adult Community Center currently shares space with Foothills Community Church in their multipurpose room that Foothills has generously offered to share. However, this shared space is woefully inadequate to continue to provide the services our seniors need. Because our staff and volunteers continue to work hard to provide services, the Center is more than a place for seniors to meet for a meal. In addition to activities like Bingo, board games, exercise classes, special events, trips to areas of interest, assistance with rides to medical appointments, transportation to Center activities and local shopping, nurse-supervised pedicures, legal advice from an attorney, bookmobile access, referrals for medical insurance information, assistance with heating bills, referrals to other county/state agencies that provide for specific needs, and a growing number of other services beneficial to our participants. Along with our primary focus on Meals on Wheels, which provides not only food, but also in-person contact with homebound seniors that is essential for providing for their safety, the Molalla Adult Community Center is a vital and worthy part of the Molalla community. We have grown exponentially and continue to expand as we see the needs of our seniors and seek to find resources for them.

Our financial need is based on the fact that our seniors do not have a place of their own, and we are rapidly growing out of the shared space at Foothills. We are seeking funds to build a new center that would belong only to our seniors and handicapped members, owned by Molalla Area Seniors, Inc. It is very difficult to function effectively in limited shared space and especially difficult to provide the necessary confidentiality. Our community of seniors continues to expand as baby-boomers age into their senior years. Many of our participants have expressed appreciation for the Center, telling us on more than one occasion that we "saved their lives" and they "don't know what they would do if they didn't have the Center." We believe this speaks to their need for their own Center, and to our worthiness as beneficiaries of your generosity. The need is great, but every gift has an impact and is greatly appreciated by our seniors. We are currently in the process of securing a piece of property but face a tremendous challenge in raising the needed funds for a new building that will provide security in meeting the needs of our community's seniors for years to come.
