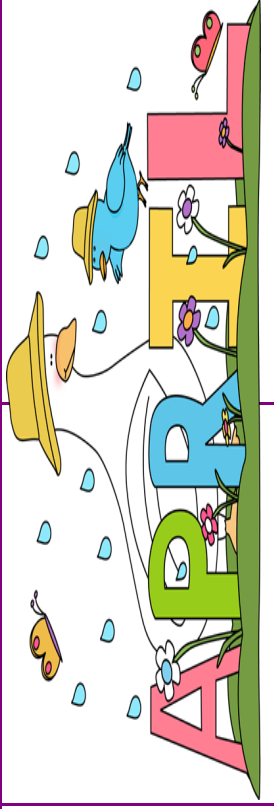

Ingredients

1 pound bacon
Freshly ground black pepper
1 pound pasta
½ cup mayonnaise
3 tablespoons Dijon mustard
3 tablespoons cider vinegar
Kosher salt
3 medium tomatoes, cut into small wedges
1 avocado, diced
1 head romaine lettuce, chopped

Directions

1. Preheat the oven to 375°F. Line a baking sheet with aluminum foil. Arrange the bacon on the baking sheet and season it generously with black pepper. Bake until the bacon is crisp, 15 to 17 minutes. Remove the pan from the oven and cool the bacon completely.
2. In a large pot over medium-high heat, bring generously salted water to a boil. Add the pasta and cook according to the package instructions. Drain and cool to room temperature.
3. In a small bowl, whisk together the mayonnaise, mustard and vinegar. Season with salt and pepper to taste.
4. In a large bowl, toss together the pasta, tomato, avocado and lettuce. Crumble in the bacon.
5. If serving immediately, add the dressing and toss well to coat. If making ahead, leave the salad undressed and store it in the refrigerator for up to two days.

MAS MEETING
February 12, 2025

The meeting was called to order by President Bob McNeil, who lead us in the Pledge of Allegiance. All members were present.

Lacressia St Clair, secretary read the minutes for the January 8th meeting. **MOTION** was made to accept the minutes as read by Howard Miller, seconded by Pat Torsen.

Judy McNeil, Treasurer gave the treasurer report. Beginning bank amount was \$6,008.38. Money Market was \$276,389.29. Income \$ 2551 with \$152.93 expenses. Savings account \$586.49. Building fund \$245,529.42; Nutrition \$10,653. Allete Fund \$41,417.37. **MOTION** was made to accept the treasurer report as read by Lacressia St Clair, seconded by Lenore Hayton.

Amanda Estrada, Center Director gave her report:

Income: \$ 22,612.32 Expenses: \$ 28,130.43 Net Income -\$5518.11 due to late reimbursements. 390 Volunteer hours, 2455 meals served, 303 bus rides, 4.5 hrs of case management, 13 reassurance calls, 9 new Meals on Wheels clients, and 6 utility assistance.

Fall 2022– The decision was made to purchase land and build a new Center.

Early 2023— Started a building fund. MAS Inc. was a recipient for the “Share the Love” Event. MAS began to look for land to buy.

Mid 2023– MAS decided to purchase land on Heintz St. that was not for sale, owner agreed to sell only for a new Center. Wet land survey was completed and approved.

February 2024– The purchase of the Property was completed. Professional engineers came forward to help and guide at no cost.

A federal ARPA Grant was awarded for \$200,000. Clackamas County Block Grant was submitted in December 2024. A letter of support was received from the City of Molalla in support of the building project.

2025-Design engineer is finalizing site plans.

A private land owner agreed to allow the sewer line to go through their property to Toliver St.

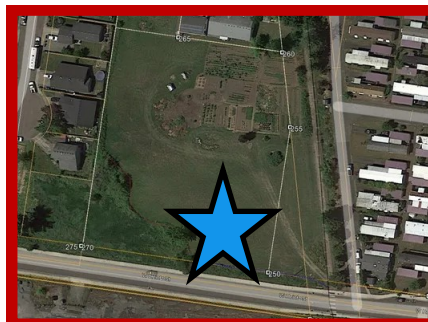
