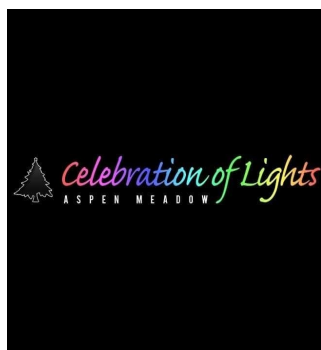

Molalla Area Seniors Board - General Meeting Minutes and Information

GENERAL MEETING
OCTOBER 24, 2025

Bob McNeil called the meeting to order.

Lacressia St Clair, secretary read the minutes from the September meeting. A **motion** was made by Tara Martin to accept the minutes as read, second by Hahn Carroll.

Judy McNeil, treasurer gave her report: Income \$1847.73, Expenses \$303.05 Net Income \$1847.73. Money Market \$319,526.60, Building Fund \$299,594.34, Savings 586.37. Nutrition Fund \$10,423. Allete Fund \$39,595.56. A **motion** was made by Lacressia St Clair to accept the report as read, second by Tara Martin.

Judy said the Allete Fund was going from private to public by year's end. We will be paid \$67 per share. We own 800 shares which will be around \$53,600. She said that there will be about \$14,073.40 taxable income from the change: but, since we are a non-profit we will not be required to pay the charge. The question in front of us now is, what do we want to do with this money?

Amanda Estrada gave the Center Report: Income \$33,553.02 Expenses \$22261.12 Net Income \$11,291.90

We had a visitor, Dave Sota, who came to the board to give us some information about some boards that the Historical Society has been storing since the 70's. These boards were removed from the old buckeroo grounds. They have the names of Veterans from this area who served in WWII. They are now being stored in a private residence to keep them dry. Dave would like for the board to take the boards. He thought they could be displayed in our new center. These boards will need some work done on them to restore them., Jojie Chapman reminded us of the sausage feed and auction, at the St James Church Sat Nov 2. Holiday Market will be Dec 6. Get your tables now.

Bob McNeil announced that he would be finished with his term as President of MAS on Dec 31, 2025. Bob McNeil and Glenn Linder will continue to be on the building committee.

Mid 2023— MAS decided to purchase land on Heintz St. that was not for sale, owner agreed to sell only for a new Center. Wet land survey was completed and approved.

February 2024— The purchase of the Property was completed. Professional engineers came forward to help and guide at no cost.

A federal ARPA Grant was awarded for \$200,000. Clackamas County Block Grant was submitted in December 2024. A letter of support was received from the City of Molalla in support of the building project.

2025-Design engineer is finalizing site plans.

A private land owner agreed to allow the sewer line to go through their property to Toliver St.

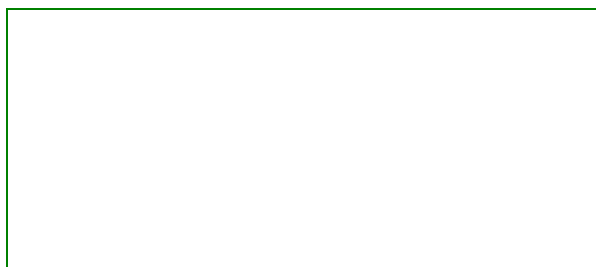
