During the Month of March our Meals on Wheels program is the focus. Our Government Funding has been reduced by over 35%. This results in over 10,000 fewer meals than the previous year. The demand for MOW continues to go up as the older population increases. The goal for March is to bring awareness of the importance of the MOW Program and the need for partnerships from individuals and businesses in our Community to help sustain our program. Many Centers around the Country are making the difficult decision to place potential clients on a wait list to receive services. It is our hope that we never have to make that decision. But as funding decreases and the demand for the service increase our Center may have to do that.





GENERAL MEETING

JAN 23, 2026

Pat Torsen, President, called the meeting to order. All board members were present, except for Rich Coleman. Lacreasia St Clair, Secretary read the minutes from the December meeting. A motion was made to accept the minutes as read by Mark Gebler and seconded by Tara Martin.

Judy McNeil, Treasurer gave her report as following:

Checking: \$9253.83 Savings: \$205.15 Money Market: \$250,545.51 with
\$204,614 being the Building Fund

Alette Fund \$54,095 Nutrition Fund \$10,173. A motion was made to accept the report as read by Tara Martin and seconded by Joanne Tabor.

Glenn Linder reported that we have received a permit for the entryway work and it would start in a couple of weeks.

Amanda Estrada, MACC Center director gave her report: Income \$23,139.79 Expenses \$24,589.36
Net Profit \$ -1449.50. 1,787 Meals served, MOW meals are being served only 5 days meals a week instead of the 7 that have been served because of budget cuts.

26.5 hrs case management 13 reassurance calls, 6 utility assistance, 381 bus rides provided.

Friday the 13th there will be a Bingo at the center for **Share The Love**.

The first Wednesday of the month there will be a fundraiser for the Nutrition Fund featuring Chicken Noodle Soup.

Jan 31, 2026 starts the **Share the Love Campaign** at the high school,

March will be Meals on Wheels month. All proceeds raised will go to the nutrition fund.

May 2 will be the Spring Market.

We are still looking for grants. Feb 6, the County Commissioners are scheduled to come to the center.

FUTURE HOME OF THE MOLALLA ADULT COMMUNITY CENTER

West Heintz Street
Between Kennel Ave & Ridings Ave

Fall 2022– The decision was made to purchase land and build a new Center.

Early 2023— Started a building fund. MAS Inc. was a recipient for the “Share the Love” Event. MAS began to look for land to buy.

Mid 2023– MAS decided to purchase land on Heintz St. that was not for sale, owner agreed to sell only for a new Center. Wet land survey was completed and approved.

February 2024– The purchase of the Property was completed. Professional engineers came forward to help and guide at no cost.

A federal ARPA Grant was awarded for \$200,000. Clackamas County Block Grant was submitted in December 2024. A letter of support was received from the City of Molalla in support of the building project.

2025-Design engineer is finalizing site plans.

February 2026– Began work on the Entry way.

A private land owner agreed to allow the sewer line to go through their property to Toliver St.

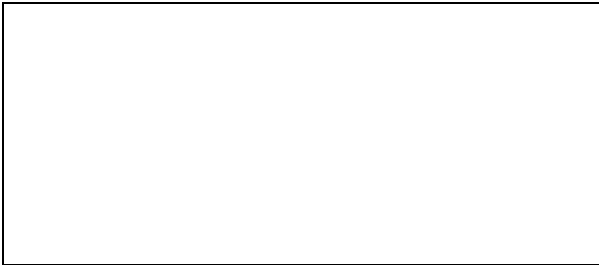
