



MAS GENERAL MEETING
FEB 27, 2026

The meeting was called to order at 12:17 by Pat Torsen, President. All board members were present.

Lacressia St Clair, Secretary read the minutes for the January meeting. A **motion** was made by Gloria and seconded by Roberta B.

Judy McNeil, Treasurer gave her report as Following:

Income \$ 78,834.73 Expenses \$4,266.42 Net Income: \$74,567.82

Checking: \$3,982.73 Savings \$205.06 Money Market: \$389,497.39 with
\$352,353.38 Building Fund, Nutrition Fund: \$9873.00.

A **motion** was made to accept the report as read by Rich Coleman, seconded by Mike Ford.

Pat presented a new fund raiser for the building. We will be selling advertisements for \$50 a month. They will be displayed on the tables in the center four days a week. We have one company that has paid for a full year.

Amanda Estrada, MACC Director, gave her report as following:

Income \$11,672.01 Expenses \$22,674.26 Net Income -\$11,002.25, The county check was late again this month. 1,747 meals served, 13.5 case management hours, 320 bus rides.

Amanda said that the center donated \$300 to Share the Love, which put us in the Bronze category. March will be Meals on Wheels month. We have a QR code for donations. We will have a spaghetti feed and auction on March 4th. The second week of March will be Spirit Week.

Amanda said that we are receiving 35% less funding than we have in the past.

There was a guest speaker, Brian Rearick during the meeting. He told us about a new housing project that may have low income housing available.

FUTURE HOME OF THE MOLALLA ADULT COMMUNITY CENTER

West Heintz Street
Between Kennel Ave & Ridings Ave

Fall 2022– The decision was made to purchase land and build a new Center.

Early 2023— Started a building fund. MAS Inc. was a recipient for the “Share the Love” Event. MAS began to look for land to buy.

Mid 2023– MAS decided to purchase land on Heintz St. that was not for sale, owner agreed to sell only for a new Center. Wet land survey was completed and approved.

February 2024– The purchase of the Property was completed. Professional engineers came forward to help and guide at no cost.

A federal ARPA Grant was awarded for \$200,000. Clackamas County Block Grant was submitted in December 2024. A letter of support was received from the City of Molalla in support of the building project.

2025-Design engineer is finalizing site plans.

February 2026– Began work on the Entry way.

A private land owner agreed to allow the sewer line to go through their property to Toliver St.

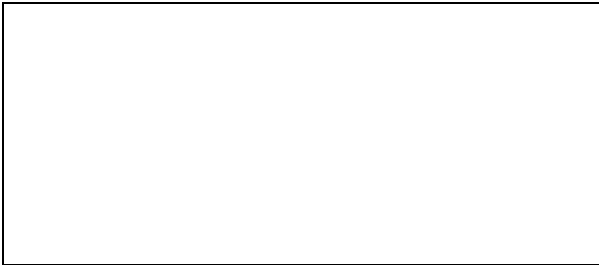
