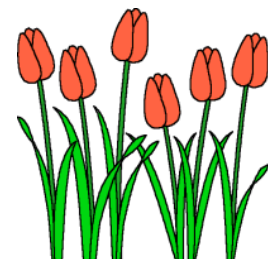

Experience 51 _____ Broadway

Broadway, New York City's theater district, runs from 41st Street to 53rd Street between Sixth and Ninth Avenues. The first theater was built in 1798 and over the years, the district has grown to 40 theaters that are now considered "on Broadway." In 1927, the street was nicknamed the "Great White Way" due to the bright white lights that illuminated the streets and advertised the multitude of shows. During this period, the shows were mostly comedies and operettas, and some vaudeville. Many of the Broadway shows that we know today were developed in the 1940s. Rodgers and Hammerstein were the pioneers who first combined song, dance, comedy and drama to create the modern musical. The lights are still shining bright, theater attendance is thriving, and to be "on Broadway" is now the most highly respected achievement for theater professionals.

Single-hotel Stays: Unpack just once and explore the world's most iconic cities during Spotlights' single-hotel stays. Important Tour Information:

The overall activity level of this tour is a level 3. This means you're an on-the-go traveler. You don't want to miss a thing, so walking and standing for longer periods of time (2-3 hours) isn't a big deal. A moderately paced two-and-a-half-hour walking tour, covering several miles, hills, and uneven surfaces, is no problem for you. Walking four miles over the course of a day is very doable, as is climbing into and out of various modes of transportation (tuk-tuk, cable car, zodiac, etc.). You can climb three flights of stairs easily and handle altitudes between 6,000 and 9,000 feet. Expect some longer days with early mornings or late nights balanced with free time to recharge or set out on your own adventure. This level is not a fit for travelers who require mobility assistance devices.

Travel with an average of 37 people (maximum of 44).

Walking to our dinner restaurants may require up to 0.75 miles each way.

If you require any special assistance while on tour, please make us aware at time of reservation so the necessary request form can be sent to your attention.

*For the matinee Broadway performance, travelers will be provided with a selection of shows to choose from. Selection of shows is subject to change based upon availability. Actual shows available for choices will be advised approximately 80 days prior to departure and must be finalized at 50 days prior to departure. Day of the Broadway show and performance selections are subject to change. Once travelers choose show of preference, changes are not permitted. Some Broadway performances may not be suitable for children; please inquire at time of reservation.

When reserving a triple room, please note that it will have two double beds. Due to fire safety regulations, a rollaway bed cannot be brought into the room.

Single accommodations are limited and are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Single rate subject to change based on availability.

To complete your tour, we include round-trip airport-to-hotel transfers when purchasing our airfare with your tour. If you have arranged for your own air, we are pleased to provide you the option of purchasing these transfers. Please note that all transfers will leave at pre-scheduled times.

For air-inclusive reservations, the name provided at time of booking must match your government-issued ID that will be used during travel. Name changes are subject to penalties.

Please be advised, many airlines do not provide advance seat assignments until check-in at the airport. Advance seating will be subject to the airline's terms and conditions.





Fall 2022– The decision was made to purchase land and build a new Center.

Early 2023— Started a building fund. MAS Inc. was a recipient for the “Share the Love” Event. MAS began to look for land to buy.

Mid 2023– MAS decided to purchase land on Heintz St. that was not for sale, owner agreed to sell only for a new Center. Wet land survey was completed and approved.

February 2024– The purchase of the Property was completed. Professional engineers came forward to help and guide at no cost.

A federal ARPA Grant was awarded for \$200,000. Clackamas County Block Grant was submitted in December 2024. A letter of support was received from the City of Molalla in support of the building project.

2025-Design engineer is finalizing site plans.

February 2026– Began work on the Entry way.

A private land owner agreed to allow the sewer line to go through their property to Toliver St.

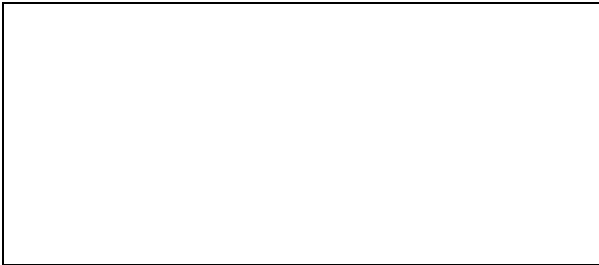
